CULTURAL CORNER

HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH (SEP - OCT 15)

Learn sbout the celebration of the historical, cultural, and societal contributions of Hispanic and Latino communities. This encompasses individuals with ancestral connections to Mexico, South and Central American countries, and the Caribbean region. The month's dates align with numerous independence dates of Latin American countries where many individuals engage in activities such as spending time with family and friends, delving into their ancestral history, preparing traditional dishes from their respective countries, and celebrating their family

heritage.

DÍA DE LOS MUERTOS (day of the dead | nov 1st & 2nd)

Learn about the Latin American holiday that celebrates the souls of the deceased. Dia de los Muertos, a holiday of Mexican origin, commemorates the return of deceased loved ones through a festive celebration that incorporates traditional foods, beverages, and merriment. There is typically an ofrenda or altar created in October to honor those who have passed away. Families will also visit, clean, and decorate ceneteries. Additionally, there are parades where people paint their faces to resemble skulls.
